





The sale of some council shared ownership homes will be subject to a local connection requirement. This means that initial priority in the sale will go to applicants with a local connection.

Local connection requirements will be clearly set out within the sales information for shared ownership properties.

Local Connection

Local connection will be established by:

i. Residence

An applicant or their partner has been a resident in the council's district for a continuous period of 2 years at the time of the application.

An applicant or their partner has been a resident in the council's district area for 10 years or more in the past.

ii. Employment

An applicant or their partner has been employed for a period of at least 5 years in the district area.

Rural Connection & Rural Exception Sites

Shared ownership properties in rural parishes may prioritise applicants with a local connection to the parish. As a minimum a rural parish connection will be established by:

i. Residence

An applicant or their partner has been resident in the rural parish for continuous period of 2 years at the time of application.

An applicant or their partner has been a resident in the rural parish for more than 2 years within the last 15 years.

ii. Employment

An applicant or their partner has been employed in the rural parish for a period of at least 2 years at the time of application.

Shared ownership homes in rural areas may have additional requirements, these will be clearly set out in the property sales information.
