Coastal Work

Timber groyne repairs and a shingle recharge are being undertaken here, as part of NFDC's annual coast protection work.

Once placed, an additional 4,500t of beach will help to defend the seafront by protecting the seawall from damaging waves. In doing so, the material will move and re-profile under coastal processes to form a natural beach slope.

Works are subject to weather and tide, which may mean some work being undertaken early / late in the day or at weekends.

Timber repairs will begin in early September, with the beach recharge following in early October. Completion is due around the end of October.

The following restrictions are likely during these works:

- Sections of the beach will be temporarily inaccessible where work is happening, to allow the safe operation of machinery
- Reduced parking in Hurst Road West Car Park, to allow delivery lorries to manoeuvre
- The set of beach steps (next to the toilet block) and an adjacent section of the promenade will be **closed**, with a diversion set up around the compound


