The Forest adapted




Why the ban was needed

23 March 2020 Lockdown

- The Forest was empty as Forestry England closed car parks exercise was walk from home with an emphasis on stay home
- 16 April Royal College of Policing released 'it was lawful to drive for a walk'.
- Increase of visitors Forest on very high fire risk banning of BBQ's
- 13 May Forestry England opened car parks to cope with visitors
- Weather was glorious, hot and dry = increased visitors and fire risk
- 16 May Launched New Forest Code
- Overflowing car parks and verge parking despite opening of car parks
- Higher level of visitors than normal
- 8 June Ban Disposable BBQ campaign in and around the New Forest
- 15 June non-essential shops could reopen in England





Fire Alert

- Met Office said it was the third warmest year in records dating back to 1884
- In May alone there were 300 wildfires
- 18 May Fire breaks out at Wareham Forest declared a major incident
- Unprecedented numbers of people visited after lockdown, many wanting to BBQ in the Forest
- Many of the visitors were 'new' to the Forest

New Forest Code

- 'New Forest organisations are appealing to people to please respect and care for the National Park and follow the New Forest code.'
- 9 short and simple messages with icons, able to use individual signs where necessary
- Backed and fully supported and promoted by all the Forest organisations on their websites, social media and press releases



BBQ Ban

- Over 50 retailers removed disposable barbecues from sale in a bid to protect the New Forest National Park from being destroyed by fire
- National supermarkets, local and independent stores inside and outside the New Forest joined the cause
- Julian Lewis took the petition to Government
- Appeared on BBC breakfast news and local news and radio
- Partnered with Forestry England And Hampshire Fire and Rescue
- Other National Parks and protected lands also banned them (Peak District NP)


