### AIM

To improve the popularity of Totton Town centre by implementing proposals identified in discussions with local businesses and residents through an engagement programme undertaken by consultants Feria in 2022.

## **ACTIVITIES**

- Improvements to the war memorial, including making it more accessible.
- Improving the arts performance area to facilitate performances by both groups and individuals.
- Introducing a human sundial.
- Providing new benches and undertaking pond, rockery and waterfall improvements within Testvale Park.
- Offering new notice boards.
- Providing equipment for the play area.
- · Introducing a new town centre market.

### AIM

Support for small scale improvements to enhance the attractiveness of five district and town centres across the New Forest.

## **ACTIVITIES**

- In Fordingbridge: new play equipment at the recreation ground.
- In Hythe and Dibden: promotion of 'green' activity through the purchase of Jute bags; improved town centre signage; partnering with Hythe Pier Heritage to provide local events.
- In Marchwood: flower and bulb planting, improved seating, and enhancements to the Falklands War Memorial.
- In New Milton: resurfacing Ashley
  Parade, the introduction of planters and
  wider improvements to the shopping
  parade.
- In Ringwood: new play equipment.
