

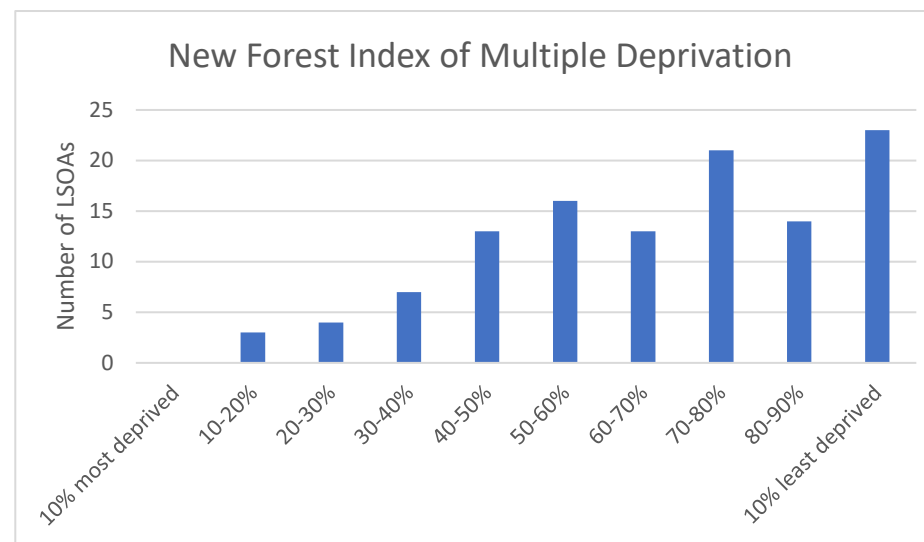
New Forest Index of Multiple Deprivation Summary 2019

New Forest District has now Lower Super Output Areas (sub ward level) within the bottom 10% most deprived in the country. Indeed the highest occurrence falls within the 10% least deprived.

The Barriers to Housing and Services Index however paints a different picture with around 11% of the District's LSOAs falling within the bottom 10% nationally and around 40% within the bottom third.

There is one single LSOA in the District which is ranked 72nd most deprived in the country out of 33,000 for the Living Environment. This places it well inside the bottom 1% in the country.

Conversely there is one New Forest LSOA ranked at 31,800 in the index of Barriers to Housing and Services. So, whilst this illustrates that particular area faces few challenges, the District as a whole is polarised in terms of this score.
